Principal's Report

Welcome to Term 2 of the 2023 school year! I hope that all students, parents and staff had an enjoyable Easter break and that everyone is feeling refreshed and ready to attack the term with enthusiasm. Term 2 promises to be a busy one, with just nine weeks of school and plenty of special events and activities taking place. I encourage students and parents to keep an eye on the 'Dates to Remember' section of the newsletter to stay abreast of what's happening at the school.

SCHOOL PHOTOS

Our school photo day is this coming Wednesday 3rd of May. This year we have engaged The Loft Studio to take our school photos. Photo order forms were sent home at the end of last term. Please ensure you return these before photo day.

School photo day is always a very special day in our calendar, with the photos taken on the day providing families with memories that can be passed on to future generations. In the past, our families have been very good at ensuring that students attend school in correct school uniform on photo day. Again, we ask for the support of parents with this to ensure that our photos are of the highest quality. In particular, I draw parents attention to the following points in our uniform policy:

- Stud earrings and sleepers worn in the ears, plus watches are the only acceptable jewellery.
- Other than clear nail polish, cosmetics may not be worn at school.
- The wearing of visible under-garments such as colourful long-sleeve shirts under a short-sleeve shirt or leggings/tights under shorts, skirts or dresses is not permitted, with the exception of those in the colours navy blue or maroon.
- Extreme hair colours (eg: green, pink or purple rinses) and/or extreme hairstyles are not permitted.
- Shoulder length hair or longer needs to be tied back.

SCHOOL UNIFORM—LABELLING CLOTHING ITEMS

I wish to congratulate our students and families for their efforts to ensure that students are attending school in proper uniform—keep up the good work! With the cooler weather now upon us, we ask that parents please ensure that their child's jumpers are clearly labelled. The students often begin the day with their jumper on and take them off when they get hot running around at playtime, increasing the possibility of the item being lost or misplaced. Clearly labelled clothing items can easily be returned to their owner! HATS

With the warmer months now behind us, students are no longer required to wear their wide-brimmed hats when outside at school. As such, we have sent each child's hat home today so they can be washed and stored in a safe place over winter.

As per our school's SunSmart Policy, hats need to be worn during the months of October-April.

PAWS IN SCHOOLS PROGRAM

Students and families who were part of our school last year would be aware of the PAWS in Schools Program and the impact that this had in promoting positive mental health amongst our students in 2022. I am excited to share with our school community that again in 2023, we will be running this program for our students. As part of this program, two therapy dogs and their handlers will be visiting our school on selected dates throughout the remainder of year. The PAWS in Schools Program is run by Therapy Dogs Australia and involves the use of therapy dogs in schools to support students to manage anxiety, develop social skills and confidence, build resilience and regulate emotions. Our first visit will be on Monday 8th May.

STAFF PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Our school is part of the Bendigo Small Schools Community of Practice. This is a group of eight schools who collaborate and combine for staff professional development, aimed at continually improving the capability of our schools to deliver high quality education outcomes for our students.

On Monday's student-free day the teachers and I attended a professional development workshop with other staff from the community of practice in Bendigo. The focus of the session was on the teaching of writing. Specifically, the teachers looked at effective teaching approaches to support students to implement the traits of good writers—voice, ideas, presentation, conventions, organisation, word choice and sentence fluency. The session was extremely valuable and provided a wonderful opportunity for our staff to network with teachers and leaders from other schools. We are now excited to implement some of the learnings from the day into the teaching of writing at our school.

We wish to inform parents of important information related to the Child Safe Standards.

The Victorian Government has announced new <u>Child</u> <u>Safe Standards</u> to further strengthen child safety across organisations, including schools.

Goornong Primary School is committed to the safety and wellbeing of all children and young people. Goornong Primary School has zero tolerance for child abuse.

Every person involved in Goornong Primary School has a responsibility to understand the important and specific role they play individually and collectively to ensure that the wellbeing and safety of all children and young people is at the forefront of all they do and every decision they make.

What are the Child Safe Standards?

The *Betrayal of Trust* report released by the Victorian Government identified that more can be done in the community to reduce and remove the risk of child abuse. As such, Ministerial Order 870 outlines a set of requirements (Child Safe Standards) that Victorian schools need to meet.

The Child Safe Standards are a set of principles that require organisations working with children to implement strategies to prevent child abuse.

Goornong Primary School has in place the following policies and documents which outline approaches to remove and/or reduce the risks of child abuse; and our commitment to providing a child-safe environment.

- Child Safety Policy.
- Child Safe Code of Conduct.
- Child Safe Reporting Obligations Policy.
- Child Safe Standards Risk Register.

We thank our school community for their support in ensuring that Goornong PS maintains a child-safe environment for all students and children.

WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECKS

We wish to remind our school community, including parents, of our school's policy regarding working with Children Checks.

Goornong Primary School values the many volunteers that assist in our classrooms, with sports events, excursions, school concerts and other school events. To ensure that we are meeting our legal obligations under the *Worker Screening Act* and the *Child Safe Standards*, Goornong Primary School is required to undertake suitability checks which in most cases will involve asking for evidence of a Working with Children (WWC) Clearance.

As such, we ask that <u>all</u> parents have a valid WWCC card.

The process to apply for a Working with Children Check card is not arduous and the school is able to support parents if necessary. We strongly encourage parents who do not currently have a WWCC card to now begin the process of applying for one. Parents who do not hold a valid card will not be able to participate in school activities such as morning reading, attending excursions or volunteering at sports days.

Please feel free to contact the school if you require support or have any questions regarding Working with Children Checks.

We thank our school community for their support with this important matter!
