
HEAD LICE

We have had some reports of possible cases of head lice at our school. Head lice is an ever-present concern at schools. Parents can help to minimise the spread of head lice at our school by completing the following steps:

- 1. Inspect your child's hair on a regular basis (once per week).
- 2. Inform the school whenever lice are detected. Notification can then be made to all parents.
- 3. Get appropriate treatment from the chemist or local council. Parents are advised that not all treatments available are totally effective. Some kill the live lice but not the eggs. If unsure check with your pharmacist.
- 4. Tie back long hair as loose hair increases the risk of the transfer of lice from one head to another.

We also ask parents to be aware that it is an Education Department regulation that parents be contacted to collect their child from school where they have evidence of live lice; and that children found to have live lice do not return to school until appropriate treatment has commenced.

We thank parents for their continued support to minimise the instances of head lice at our school.

STUDENT-FREE DAYS

As was communicated at the end of Term 1, we have some upcoming student-free days, including this coming Friday.

CLUSTER CROSS COUNTRY RUN DETAILS

Each year our school participates in the Campaspe Cluster Cross Country run. This year's event will be held at the Elmore Field Days site on Wednesday 8th May and is for all students in Years P-6.

SCHOOL REVIEW—OVERVIEW

I wish to inform our school community that 2024 is a year of review for our school. All Government schools go through a school review process every four years to evaluate how effective they have been in achieving the goals set out in their Strategic Plan and to develop goals for the coming four years. Essentially, the review is an opportunity for schools to identify what's working well and what needs improvement with regards to teaching & learning, student engagement & wellbeing and partnerships with families & the community.

As part of the review process, throughout Term 2 our school will complete a Self Evaluation. This will involve analysing student learning and wellbeing data, as well as getting feedback from a range of stakeholders including students, parents and school staff.

Once the school has completed its Self Evaluation, the next stage of the review process will take place in Term 3, when an educational consultant and other leaders in education visit our school to further investigate our achievements and areas for improvement.

Our entire staff team is excited about going through the review process and we are looking forward to sharing with our school community the findings at the conclusion of the review process.

Use of the School Grounds Out of School Hours

Parents and students may have noticed the new signs at the entrance to the school. Unfortunately, over the past few weeks there has been some vandalism at the school after hours and over the weekend, which we believe has been caused by individuals not connected to our school. We have reported these matters to the police.

Whilst the school encourages members of the local community (including current and former students) to use the playground, basketball court and oval out of school hours, we do ask that visitors please respect the school facilities and leave the grounds as they found them. We also ask that visitors please be aware of the following:

- Due to the school now running an after school care program, the school grounds and facilities are not available for public use prior to 6pm on school days.
- All minors (including current and former students) visiting the school out of school hours <u>must</u> be supervised by their parent or guardian.
- Bicycles, scooters and skateboards are not to be ridden on the school grounds at any time.
- Dogs and other animals, such as horses, are not permitted on school grounds.
- The school expects that those using the school facilities out of school hours will leave the grounds as they found them. Anyone found to be engaging in vandalism or damaging school property will be referred to the police and may be charged with trespass.

Our School Council wishes to thank our current students and families who we know show care and respect for our school and its grounds when attending out of hours. We encourage these families to continue to enjoy using the school's facilities out of hours.









What are the Child Safe Standards?

The Child Safe Standards are a set of principles that require organisations working with children to implement strategies to prevent child abuse. Note that child abuse includes Physical child abuse, Child abuse, Crooming, Emotional child abuse, Neglect, and Family violence.

There are 11 Child Safe Standards:

- Culturally safe environments.
- Child safety and wellbeing is embedded in leadership, governance and culture.
- Child and student empowerment.
- Family engagement.
- Diversity and equity.
- Suitable staff and volunteers.
- Complaints processes.
- Child safety knowledge, skills and awareness.
- Child safety in physical and online environments.
- Review of child safety practices.
- Implementation of child safety practices.

Our Commitment to Child Safety

Goornong Primary School is committed to safety and wellbeing of all children and young people. This will be the primary focus of our care and decision-making.

Goornong Primary School has zero tolerance for child abuse.

We are committed to providing a child safe environment where children and young people are safe and feel safe, and their voices are heard about decisions that affect their lives.

Every person involved in Goornong Primary School has a responsibility to understand the important and specific role they play individually and collectively to ensure that the wellbeing and safety of all children and young people is at the forefront of all they do and every decision they make.
